The not-for-profit organisation, run solely by volunteers, is dedicated to finding homes for abandoned cats and kittens.

Re-homing almost 200 felines since opening, Ms Maslen said she was not selective.

Each animal is de-sexed, micro-chipped, vaccinated, worm and flea treated, and vet-checked.

All potential owners are screened using a questionnaire designed to ensure the best possible match.

The 2nd Chance Cat Rescue team is hosting an adoption day at the Hampton Park Veterinary Hospital between 11am and 1pm on Sunday.
