

Tour will make you flip Jamie First

A couple of Aussies and a Scot will be turning Chapel Off Chapel on its head next month.

Local singer/songwriters Lachlan Bryan and Aleyce Simmonds, along with the UK's Jack Henderson, are taking to the Prahran stage on February 2 for their Upside Down tour.

Bryan said the country music-inspired performance was a collaborative event that was different to anything he had done before.

"Instead of one person just playing a set and then another person getting up and then another ... we kind of just become each other's band and trade songs," he said.

"It's like you (the audience) are in on a songwriters' get-together."

Bryan said the best part about working with the other artists was everyone had a unique sound.

"If you're looking for Keith Urban or that sort of style, you're probably coming to the wrong show.

"We're influenced by country music, but we all have a completely different take on it."

Following performances in Europe last year and throughout Australia, Bryan said the seventh and final stop of the tour (in Melbourne) would be unlike the others.

"The shows are constantly evolving because we're all songwriters, so we're always writing, so there's even potential there will be new songs by then."
